

UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

***Due to the federal government shutdown, the unemployment rate for October 2025 is not available.**

General Trend: Unemployment rates in both Metro North WDA and MA were relatively stable from Sept. through Dec. 2025. Metro North saw a slight increase from 4.1% in Sept. to 4.2% in Nov. before returning to 4.1% in December. MA rose slightly from 4.5% to 4.7% and remained at that level in December.

Metro North WDA maintained lower unemployment rates than the statewide average.



SEASONAL TRENDS

Following the summer months, unemployment rates in both Metro North WDA and MA remained relatively stable through fall and early winter.

CONCLUSION

The unemployment rate in Metro North WDA continues to remain below the statewide average.



The data shows a consistent gap between the labor force and the total employed from 2019 to 2025. In 2020, the gap peaked, with 39,940 fewer employed individuals compared to the labor force, likely due to the economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Since then, the gap has been narrowing, with the difference decreasing to 20,512 in December of 2025, indicating continued improvement in employment levels. While this trend points to recovery, **the labor market has not yet fully returned to pre-pandemic levels**, influenced by factors such as **increased retirements, slack economic conditions, and labor force exits among some foreign-born workers.**

JOB POSTING BREAKDOWN


Lightcast provides local job posting data on employer demand based on occupation, industry, and various other details. According to the latest estimates, the total number of job postings in Metro North has decreased.

Job posting trends indicate a decrease in postings from October-December 2025 compared to July-September 2025. However, when compared to the same time period in 2024, postings increased slightly. Between October-December of 2024, there were 31,618 unique job postings, while the same time period in 2025 saw 32,733 job postings, an increase of 1,115. Despite this improvement, hiring activity falls short when compared to pre-pandemic levels. In October-December 2019, there were 39,811 unique job postings, indicating the **job market has not returned to pre-pandemic levels.**

TOP POSTED OCCUPATIONS



From October to December 2025, job posting data reflects strong demand across Healthcare, Retail Trade, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, and Administrative Support and Waste Management industries.


Healthcare remains the strongest hiring industry, with Registered Nurses, Medical and Health Services Managers, Radiologic Technologists & Technicians, and Physical Therapists.

The Retail Trade sector also shows steady hiring for Retail Sales Associates, and First-Line Supervisors.


In the Professional, Scientific and Technical Service sector, demand for Software Developers remains high, while business and customer service roles such as General and Operations Managers, Project Management Specialists, and Secretaries and Admin Assistants continue to support regional employment needs.

JOB POSTINGS: TOP CITIES

Job postings remain **highly concentrated in Cambridge**, which continues to serve as Metro North's WDA primary employment hub, followed by Burlington, Somerville, and Woburn.



TOP EMPLOYERS



From October to December 2025, Beth Israel Lahey Health, Mass General Brigham, and Harvard University posted the highest number of job openings, reflecting continued **strong demand in healthcare and education.**



This underscores the **importance of both specialized healthcare skills and fundamental professional qualifications** in the job market.




EDUCATION BREAKDOWN



The education breakdown of job postings in Metro North WDA vary widely. Nearly half of postings (46%) do not specify a required level of education. Among postings that list education requirements, 16% require a high school diploma or GED, 6% seek candidates with an Associate's degree, and 31% require a Bachelor's degree. Additionally, 15% of job postings require a Master's degree, while 8% require a Ph.D. or professional degree. This data indicates a diverse range of educational requirements, with a **significant emphasis on higher education**.

BUSINESS CHARACTERISTICS




This data reveals that **small businesses**, especially those with fewer than 20 employees, **represent the largest portion of this segment.**

To break it down: 33% of these businesses employ between 1 to 4 people, 27% have 5 to 9 employees, and 22% consist of 10 to 19 employees. Altogether, this shows that 82% of businesses are classified as small enterprises with fewer than 20 employees.


Population Trends

As of 2025, the region's population increased by 4.1% since 2019, growing by 34,015. Population is expected to increase by 3.1%, between 2024 and 2029, adding 25,535



Job Trends

From 2019 to 2024, jobs declined by 0.4% in Metro North WDA from 493,510 to 491,482. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 4.4% by 4.8%.



MEDIAN ADVERTISED HOURLY WAGE



From October to December 2025, the average hourly wage was \$38.58. This reflects an increase of **increase of \$0.71 per hour** compares to the previous quarter (July-September 2025)






NUMBER OF UNIQUE JOB POSTINGS
