
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


UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

*Due to the federal government shutdown, the unemployment rate for September 2025 is not available for this analysis.

General Trend: Unemployment rates in both Metro North WDA and MA remained stable over the summer months. Metro North recorded 4.3% in July and August while MA declined slightly from 4.8% to 4.7%. Compared to the same time period in 2024 (4.0% in Metro





SEASONAL TRENDS

Both Metro North and MA unemployment rates remained steady over the summer, with Metro North at 4.3% in both July and August and MA showing a slight decrease from 4.8% to 4.7%.

CONCLUSION

After earlier fluctuations in the spring, the unemployment rates in Metro North and MA have stabilized.

LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION



The data shows a consistent gap between the labor force and the total employed from 2019 to 2024. In 2020, the gap peaked, with 39,940 fewer employed individuals compared to the labor force, likely due to the economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Since then, the gap has been narrowing, with the difference decreasing to 26,262 in August of 2025. This suggests a recovery in employment rates, but the labor market has not yet fully returned to pre-pandemic levels, as the gap in 2019 was only 11,358. The overall trend indicates gradual improvement in employment relative to the available labor force.

JOB POSTING BREAKDOWN


Lightcast provides local job posting data on employer demand based on occupation, industry, and various other details.


Unique Job Postings This Quarter Change in Job Postings Over

Job posting trends indicate an increase in hiring activity in Q3 of 2025, compared to the same time period in 2024. Between July and September 2024, there were 32,842 job postings, while the same time period in 2025 saw 36,293 postings, an increase of 3,451.

However, when compared to pre-pandemic levels, hiring activity still falls short. In July-September 2019, there were 38,589 unique job postings, 2,296 more than in 2025. This suggests that while hiring is gradually recovering, the job market has yet to fully return to prepandemic levels.


TOP POSTED OCCUPATIONS




From July to September 2025, job posting data shows strong demand across healthcare, retail, technology, and business management. Healthcare leads the market with Registered Nurses (3,370 postings), Medical and Health Services Managers (633), Radiologic Technologists (575), and Physical Therapists (547). The retail sector also shows steady hiring for Retail Sales Associates (791) and First-Line Supervisors (490). In technology, demand for Software Developers (602) remains high, while business and customer service roles such as General and Operations Managers (454), Customer Service Representatives (448), and Sales Representatives (413) continue to support regional employment needs.

JOB POSTINGS: TOP CITIES

The data provided below represents the number of job postings in different cities within Metro North. Cambridge is highlighted as the dominant employment hub, followed by Burlington and Woburn.



TOP EMPLOYERS



From July to September 2025, Sanofi (875 postings), Beth Israel Lahey Health (623), and Cambridge Health Alliance (615) had the highest number of job postings, reflecting continued strong demand in the healthcare and life sciences sectors. Mass General Brigham (597) and Massachusetts General Hospital (259) further underscores this regional trend. Outside of healthcare, Harvard University (385) and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (216) showed steady hiring activity in higher education, while staffing and recruiting firms such as Jobot (396), GPAC (239), and Beacon Hill Staffing Group (217) continued to drive demand for professional and technical roles across industries.



This underscores the importance of both specialized healthcare skills and fundamental professional qualifications in the job market.






The education breakdown of job postings in Metro North WDA reveals that 47% of job postings do not list a specific education requirement. Among those that do, 16% require a high school diploma or GED, 7% seek candidates with an associates degree, and 30% require a Bachelor's degree.

Additionally, 15% of job postings require a Master's degree, while 7% require a Ph.D. or professional degree.

This data indicates a diverse range of educational requirements, with a significant emphasis on higher education applications.

BUSINESS CHARACTERISTICS




This data reveals that small businesses, especially those with fewer than 20 employees, represent the largest portion of this segment. To break it down: 33% of these businesses employ between 1 to 4 people, 27% have 5 to 9 employees, and 22% consist of 10 to 19 employees.

Altogether, this shows that 82% of businesses are classified as small enterprises with fewer than 20 employees.


Population Trends

As of 2025, the region's population increased by 4.1% since 2019, growing by 34,015. Population is expected to increase by 3.1%, between 2024 and 2029, adding 25,535



Job Trends

From 2019 to 2024, jobs declined by 0.4% in Metro North WDA from 493,510 to 491,482. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 4.4% by 4.8%.



MEDIAN ADVERTISED HOURLY WAGE



From July to September 2025, the average hourly wage was \$37.87. This reflects an increase of increase of \$0.05 per hour compares to the previous quarter (April-June 2025).


