## MassHire Metro North Workforce Board Leads Digital Equity Initiative with \$4.12 Million Grant from Massachusetts Broadband Institute

Somerville, February 5, 2024 – The MassHire Metro North Workforce Board (MNWB) and its Work to THRIVE Initiative (WtT), along with valuable community partners, are proud to announce the launch of the Digital Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (JEDI) Consortium. This groundbreaking initiative aims to address digital inequities in the Metro North and North Shore regions of Massachusetts.

Since its launch in 2021, MNWB's equity-focused initiative, Work to THRIVE, has actively addressed gaps in the public workforce development system, particularly in priority cities such as Chelsea, Everett, Revere, and Malden. As digital literacy and access have become indispensable to finding employment and advancing careers in today's job market, WtT has increasingly prioritized digital equity initiatives. This funding will amplify WtT's impact by leveraging existing networks in the Metro North and North Shore regions, including a partnership with MassHire North Shore.

The Digital JEDI Consortium will address the digital equity needs of Metro North and North Shore residents through comprehensive digital literacy training, device refurbishment and distribution, education, outreach, and adoption programs. The Digital JEDI program offers a comprehensive suite of services, including recruiting, hiring, training, and supporting a cohort of 32 Digital Navigators (DNs) dedicated to priority communities. It includes tiered digital literacy classes at Career Centers and community-based organizations, as well as the distribution of high-quality refurbished laptops, peripherals, Internet access, and IT support for residents. The structure in each community is specifically tailored to meet its unique needs, ensuring a targeted and effective approach to addressing digital equity challenges.

"The Digital JEDI Consortium, supported by this grant from Mass Broadband Institute, is a critical investment in the communities of Metro North and North Shore," said MNWB President and CEO Chris Albrizio-Lee. "The work of this Consortium will be invaluable to closing the digital gap in our regions' most disproportionately affected communities. We're thankful to MBI and look forward to working with nearly two dozen partners to address the digital equity needs of Metro North and North Shore."
